**BIAA had three subcontracts for consultation and research dissemination under The Mount Sinai School of Medicine's NIDRR's TBI Model Systems Grant, each not to exceed \$1,000:
From 10/1/2008 – 9/30/2009, 10/1/2009 – 9/30/2010 and from 10/1/2010 – 9/30/2011**

BIAA currently has a subcontract to the supplement to The Mount Sinai School of Medicine's NIDRR's TBI Model Systems Grant (Their Grant #133A070033) to prepare and widely disseminate a "TBI Policy Newsletter" on the importance of identification of children with traumatic brain injury (TBI) in schools, not to exceed \$12,000.

BIAA had subcontract from the Oregon Center for Applied Research, which they received the final payment for at the beginning of 2009. It was part of an NIH, National Institute of Child Health and Human Development grant or contract. They received \$3,000 in 2009.
